What Will Family Development Do For Me?

Family Development restores a sense of self-reliance and community to people who have lost faith in their ability to provide for themselves and their families. The program helps people live “the good life” with health and dignity.



Family Development helps families see their own strengths, reflect critically on how they arrive where they are, and determines what will help them move forward.

Families work with CADAC to create goals, find the services they need to reach their goals, develop the skills they need to become stronger, and make the connections in the community to become self-sufficient.

Important Steps of Family Development

- ◆ The family develops a trusting relationship with a Family Development Specialist (FDS).
 - ◆ A FDS helps the family assess its needs and strengths.
 - ◆ The family sets its own goals.
 - ◆ The FDS helps the family make a written plan for reaching these goals. The family and FDS each work on the plans.
 - ◆ The family leans and uses skills needed to become self-reliant continuously.
 - ◆ The family uses services as stepping stones to reach their goals.
- The family becomes stronger and is better able to manage future challenges.

Qualifications, Credentialing, and Beliefs

The Family Development Training and Credentialing Program is a professional development course and credentialing program for frontline family staff who learn and practice skills of strength-based family support.

Staff take the 90 hour course, prepare a portfolio documenting their abilities in the strengths-based family support and pass a credentialing exam.
