What is the FDC?

The Family Development Credential Program (FDC) provides front-line agency workers with the skills and competencies necessary to empower individuals and families to solve problems and to set and reach their own goals.

There is a widespread consensus among families, workers, and policymakers that services for families must change.

Family workers need systematic, comprehensive coursework to help families take a larger role in shaping their own futures.

The FDC uses a well-researched, strengths-based, help-seeking family support approach. The curriculum was developed at Cornell University and has been implemented throughout the country.

The FDC program transforms the way agencies and communities interact with families.



"I have to think (the FDC) has had an impact. Our turnover rate in the division that we started this was about 40% a year. Our turnover rate during the time period we've had (the FDC) has been almost zero."

A Movement for Agency Change

The FDC is designed to reorient human service agency practices to the family support model by providing cross-agency training for family workers on family support principles.

The FDC guides individuals and families to use services as stepping stones to self-reliance and interdependence with their communities rather than getting caught in the trap of dependency.

You Can Empower Families

- ◆ Support legislation which moves human service agencies toward the family support approach.
- ◆ Urge state agency administrators to implement the FDC program for workers who interact with individuals and families.
- Promote employer benefits. The FDC increases productivity, strengthens workers, and has a direct and positive impact on every employer's bottom line.
- Save taxpayer dollars and improve communities. The FDC reduces service duplication and is based on collaboration saving taxpayer dollars; it improves awareness and utilization of existing services to make all systems run more efficiently.
- ◆ Provide more constituent benefits. FDC empowers families by helping people reach their own goals for self-reliance and interdependence. Strong families = healthy, productive communities.
