## Federal Law Requires All Passengers To Wear A Mask When Boarding And During Travel

All Passengers and drivers are required to wear a mask while boarding, disembarking, and for the duration of travel.

The mask must cover the mouth and nose.

Passengers will be monitored to ensure that they continue to wear a mask during travel.

Passengers who refuse to wear a mask will be removed from the vehicle at the earliest opportunity.

The mask requirement applies to people ages 2 and up.

## The following people and activities are exempt from the order's mask requirements:

- People with a disability, as defined by the ADA, who cannot wear, or cannot safely wear, a mask.
- While eating, drinking, or taking medication.
- Drivers, when they are the only one on board the vehicle.
- While communicating with a person who is hearing impaired, when the ability to see the mouth is essential for communication.
- When necessary to verify the identity of the individual.
- Employees for whom wearing a mask creates a risk to workplace safety.
